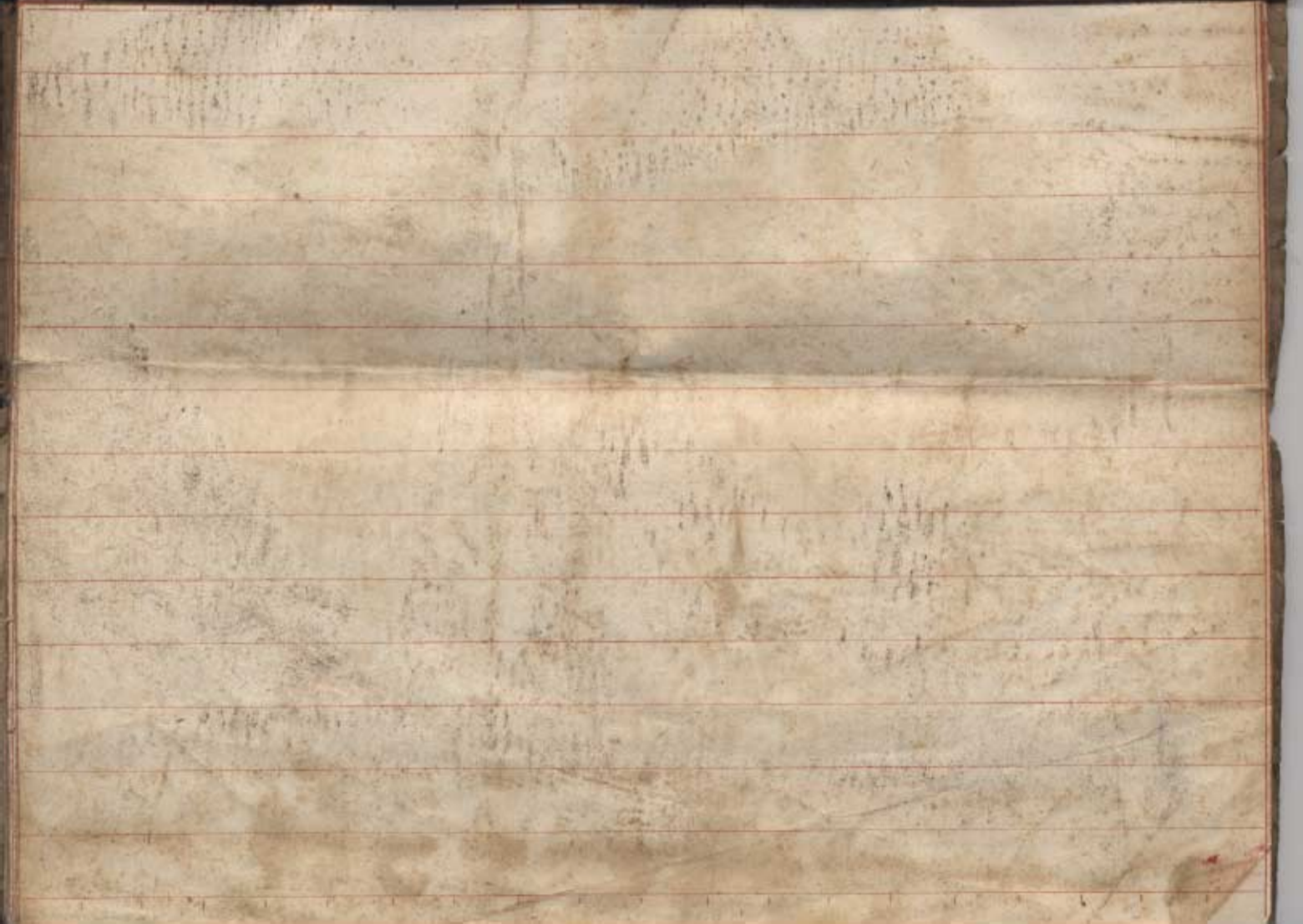
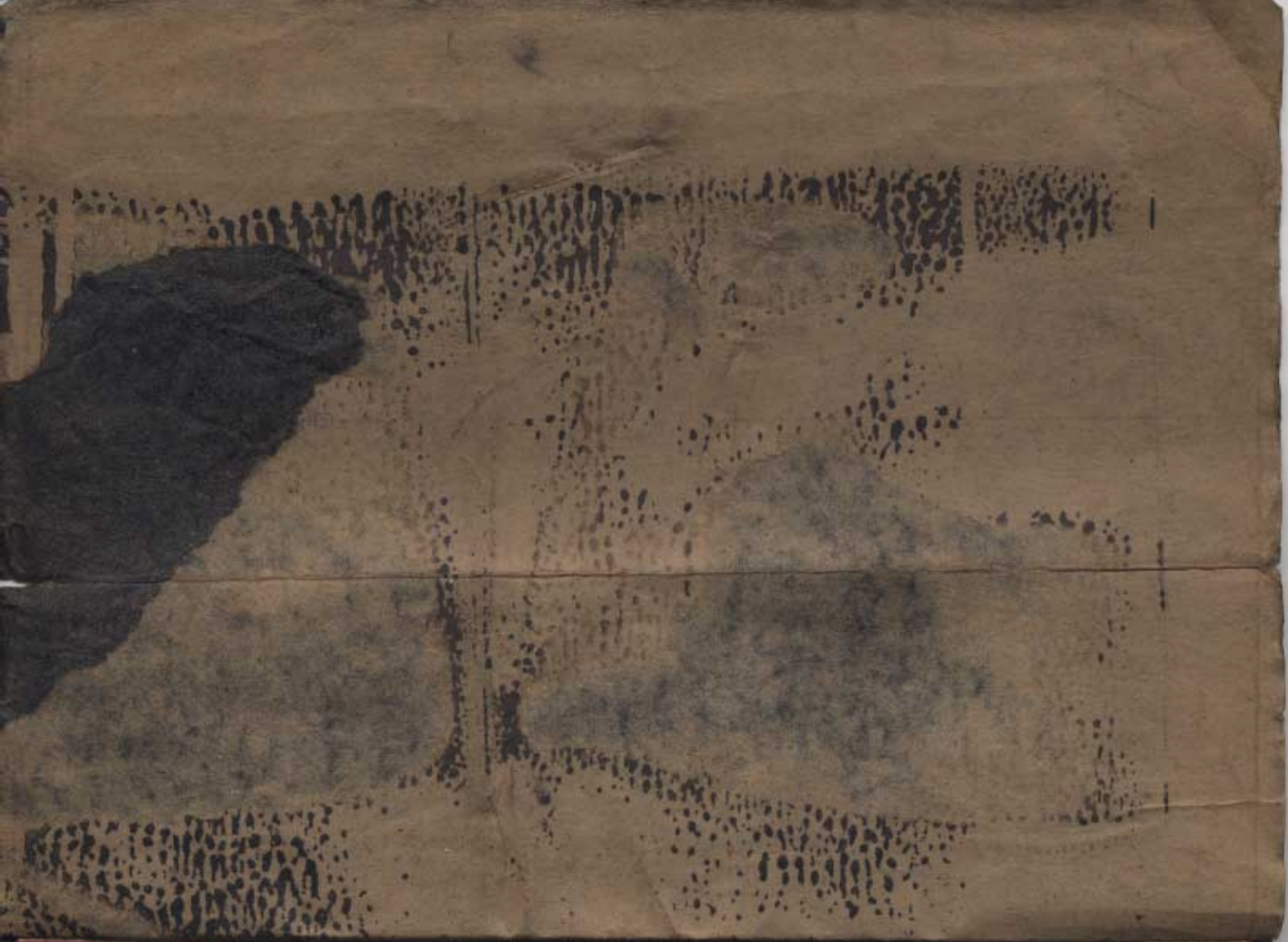

26.7.46 Received my first letter from home since I left England

25.8.45 Received 1 more letter

15.8.45 Today is usual, yasuno, day but at 9 PM we were told that owing to the hard work the 26<sup>th</sup> would be another yasuno day

16.8.45 Today we are told that owing to the men losing weight tomorrow would be yet another yasuno day. But I have been putting two and two together and come to the conclusion, for the past 3 or 4 months we have had many heavy air raids

and during this past 4 weeks we have had 3, 4, and 5 raids per day yet the past 3 days we have not even had a warning so I think that there is a force of some kind in operation

17.5.45 It is as I thought; today the commandant made a speech saying that peace had been signed.

18.5.45 Today we had not even heard all told, since we have been P.O.W.s, I work out that I have had about 10 full parcels in three and a half years which is very poor going.

19.5.45 Today they marked the camp with P.O.W. in large white letters, and they say that American planes are going to drop food and supplies by parachute.

20.5.45 Three American fighters came flying over the camp today at 12 o'clock but no packages were dropped. The rumor goes to say that some time between now and the 29th.



26.8.45 The American planes did not show up again today but of course there is plenty of time yet between now and the 29th which are the days they are to be expected, and the last two days the Nip. planes are conspicuous by their absence.

27.8.45 Today it is pouring down with rain and visibility is practically nil and we heard a plane over but could not see anything and are sure they could not see us but we are still hoping as it is we got a rather increase from 630 grams to 770 grams and also killed the pig. I received another letter from home today.

28.8.45 Today I think is the greatest day of my life for it is today the first food carrying planes came over and the first load of food was parachuted dropped right in the camp followed by about 208 more planes (B29) each plane must have been carrying 2 or 4 tons of goods. As soon as it dropped we all ran out of camp collecting

The stuff the amount collected was about 75% of what was dropped the rest fell in rivers or other places we could not get at. of all that was dropped I estimate that 50% was totally junk to pieces and will not be of any use whatever, but even so we have enough food and tobacco and sweets to keep us for a few days. never did I see such a sight in all my life as those great planes dropping hundreds of parachutes and many of the containers broke away from the chute's and thousands of pounds worth of food and other goods were destroyed and 1 nip civilian was killed and 4 more seriously injured.

29.8.45 No sleep last night or today working like hell, getting the stuff into the camp and stores for the first time in almost four years I have got my stomach full and I feel as though

I am going to pay for it but for once it is worth it, the stuff  
the Yank put in here now is surprising, He shall be working all  
night as far as I can see and all day tomorrow but who minds  
about that after thinking we were going to starve to death. The  
planes came over again today but did not drop any thing  
more not that we need it nor can we handle it, we have  
got stiff allover the office the cook-house in fact all  
over the camp, there is enough burst tins in the cook-  
house to keep the camp going for two - or three days or  
I should say until it goes bad. The whole camp is now  
smelling pretty awful and the smell of food makes me  
feel sick, this is funny after being nearly starved for  
an 4 years but it is true.

30-8-45. Went for my first walk today and got back about

11 o'clock and about 12 o'clock the planes came over again and chopped another pound on the camp almost before the last lot had been chopped and the camp cleaned up now the camp is as flat as ever again. We have now enough eggs to last us nearly a month and enough food to last us a week or 10 days even then we shall get rice and veg I suppose, I think my days of hunger are now over and I am looking forward to a speedy return home and I hope I will be there by Christmas.

3:8 45 Same again today, the planes came again but they did not chop so much as they did on previous times but it was quite enough to handle. I have been working in the office since the war finished and I need it for exercise. I am putting on weight, hand over hand on the 15th of Aug. I expect

set 3 and now I weigh 91 lb so you look like having a second feather. Marston if I don't soon get out of the place. I went out to dinner last night at a Japanese house he is a very big man in the district and it was quite big spread and I quite enjoyed it.

4.9.42 Nothing much doing today only plenty of rain it is absolutely pouring down and has not stopped all day. it has never rained so hard in Japan since I have been here.

5.9.42 It is still pouring down with rain and no signs of it abating. but what's the odds, the war is over and I shall soon be home again so I don't mind being tied indoors for a few days, still I have plenty of work to do running about the camp, slipping down for meals and doing odd jobs of work.

6.7.45. The weather has cleared a bit and I went for a walk down the village and have been asked out to dinner again tomorrow night to the same place.

7.9.45. Went out to dinner again tonight on my own and had quite a good time. I also had my photo taken ~~which~~ which is the first time I have sat for a photo in my life and I hope it turns out well.

~~8.9.45~~ Went down to the Garage again for a run home at two.

9.9.45. Went to dinner at Yamitau's house and later had photo taken then went to Cinema.

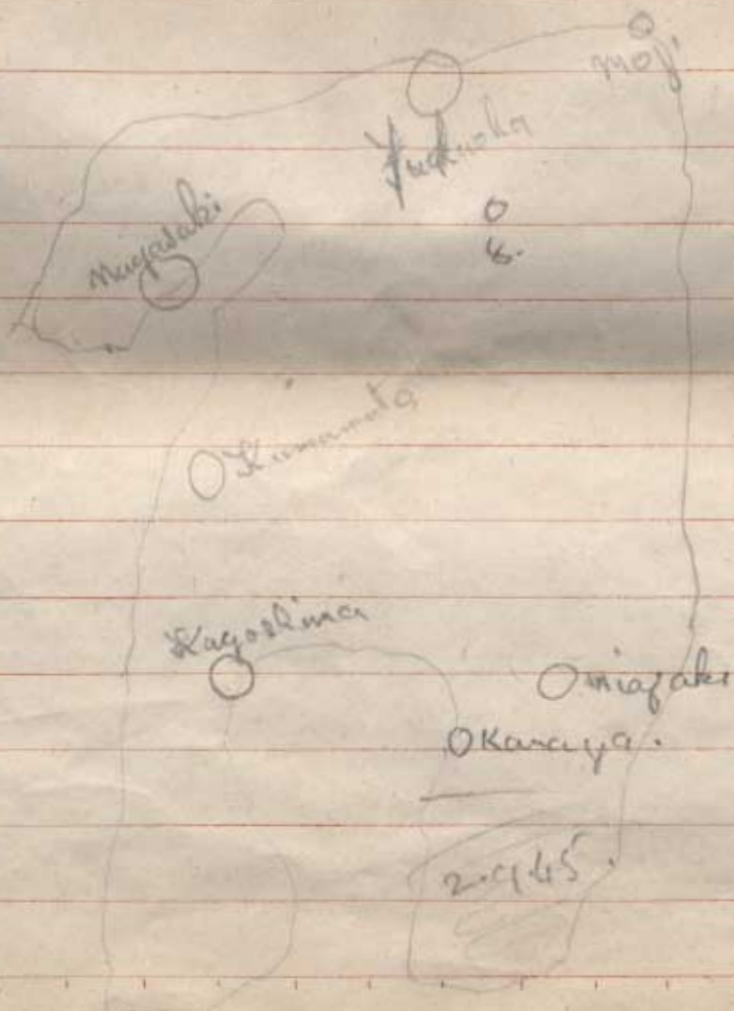

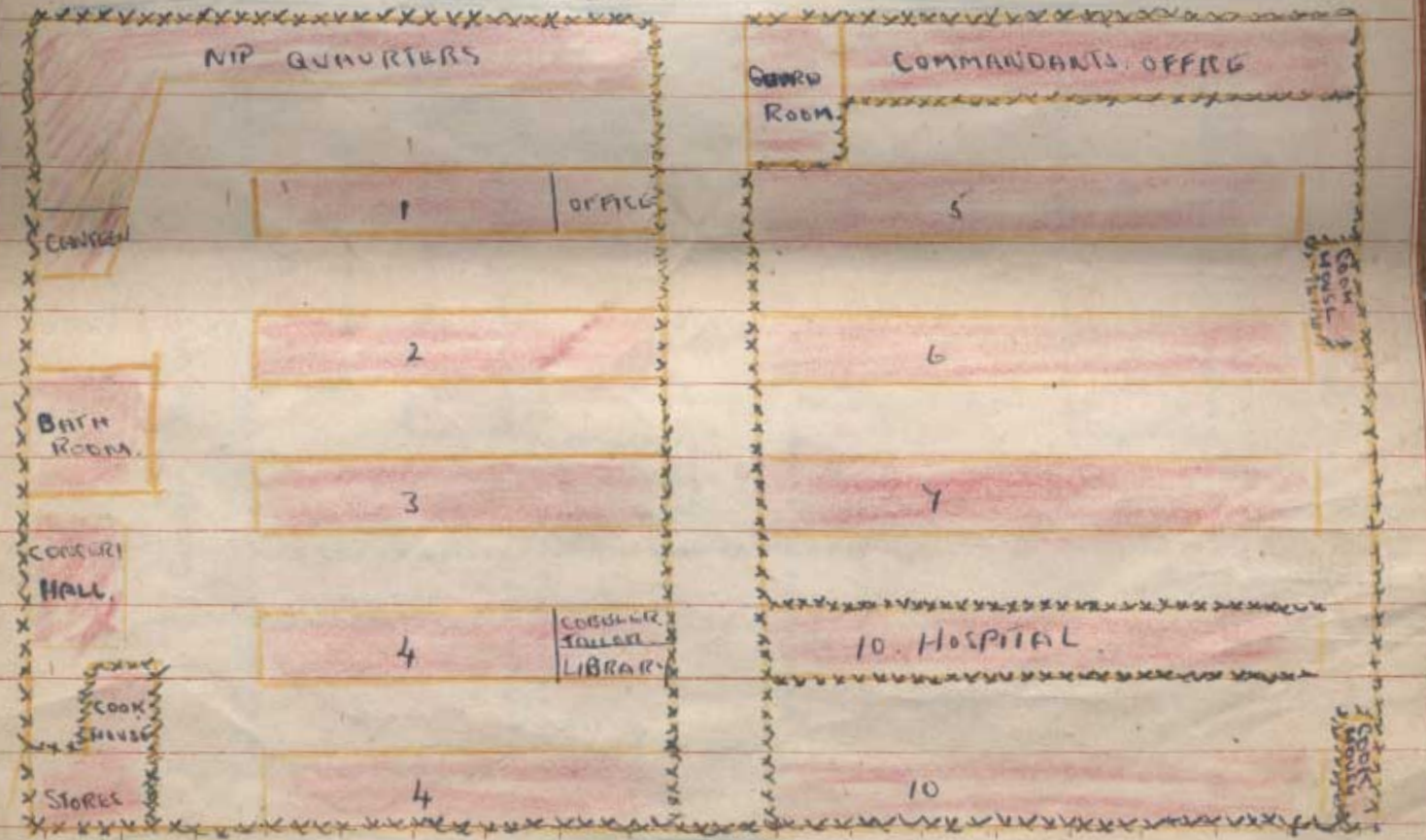

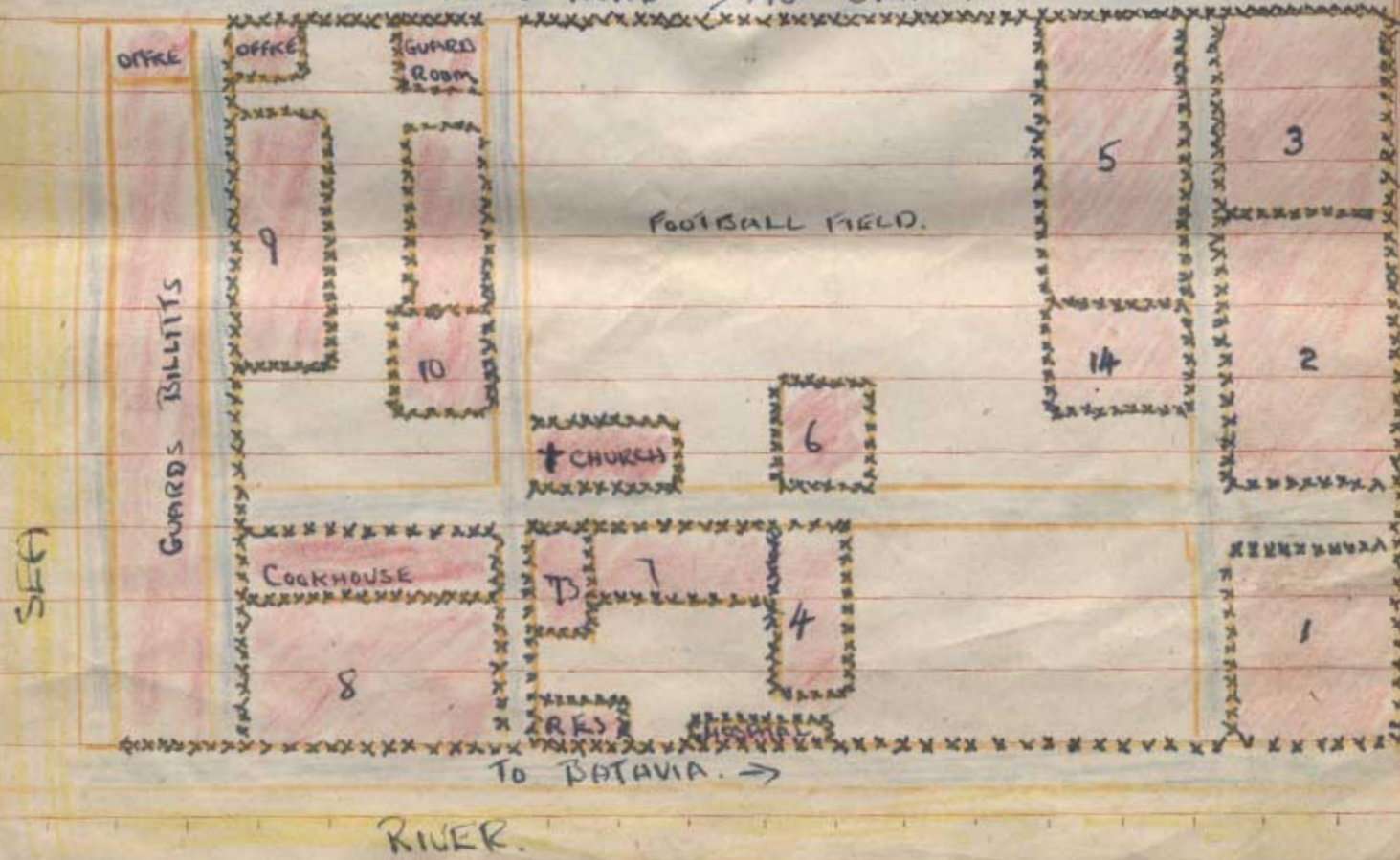

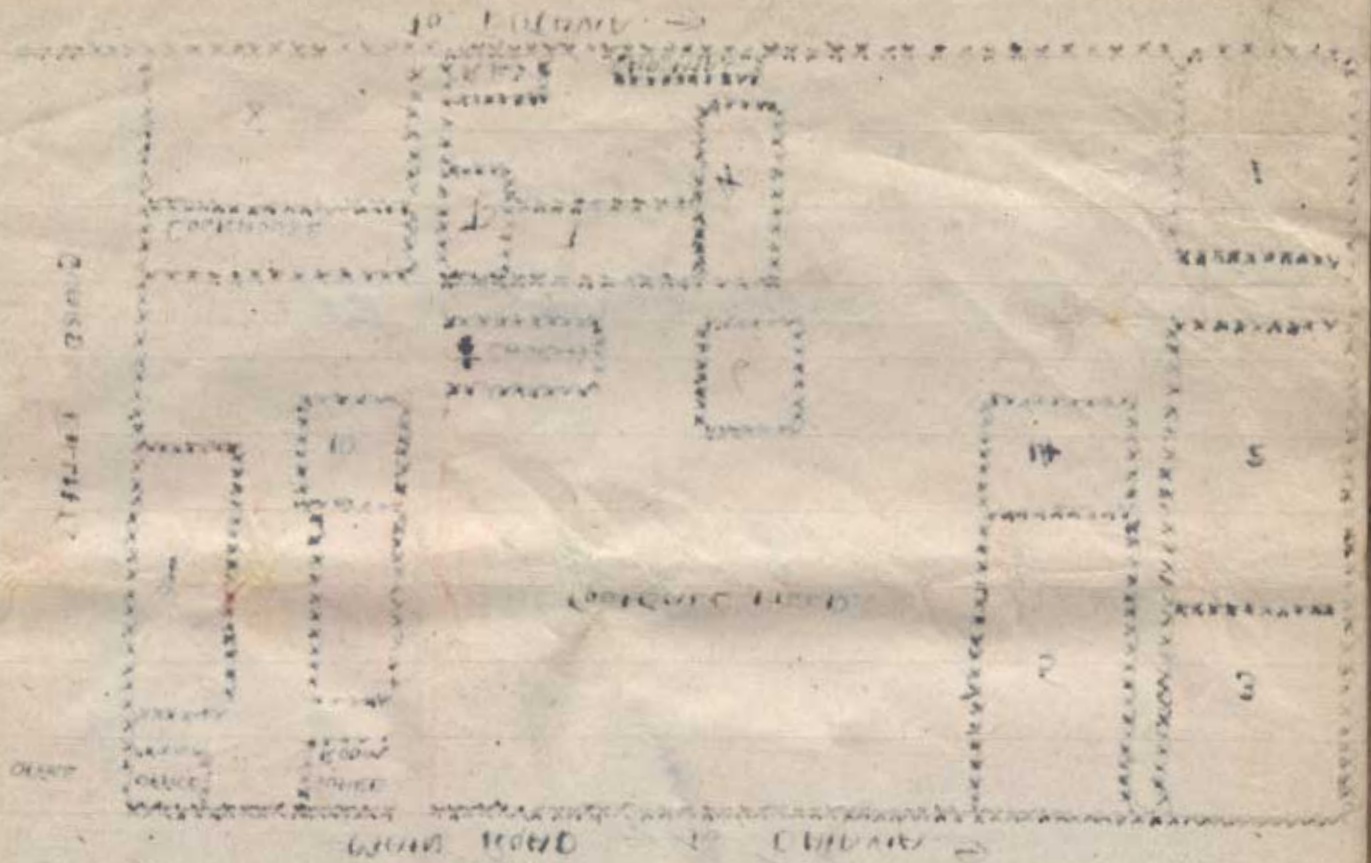

MAIN ROAD → TO BATAVIA. S



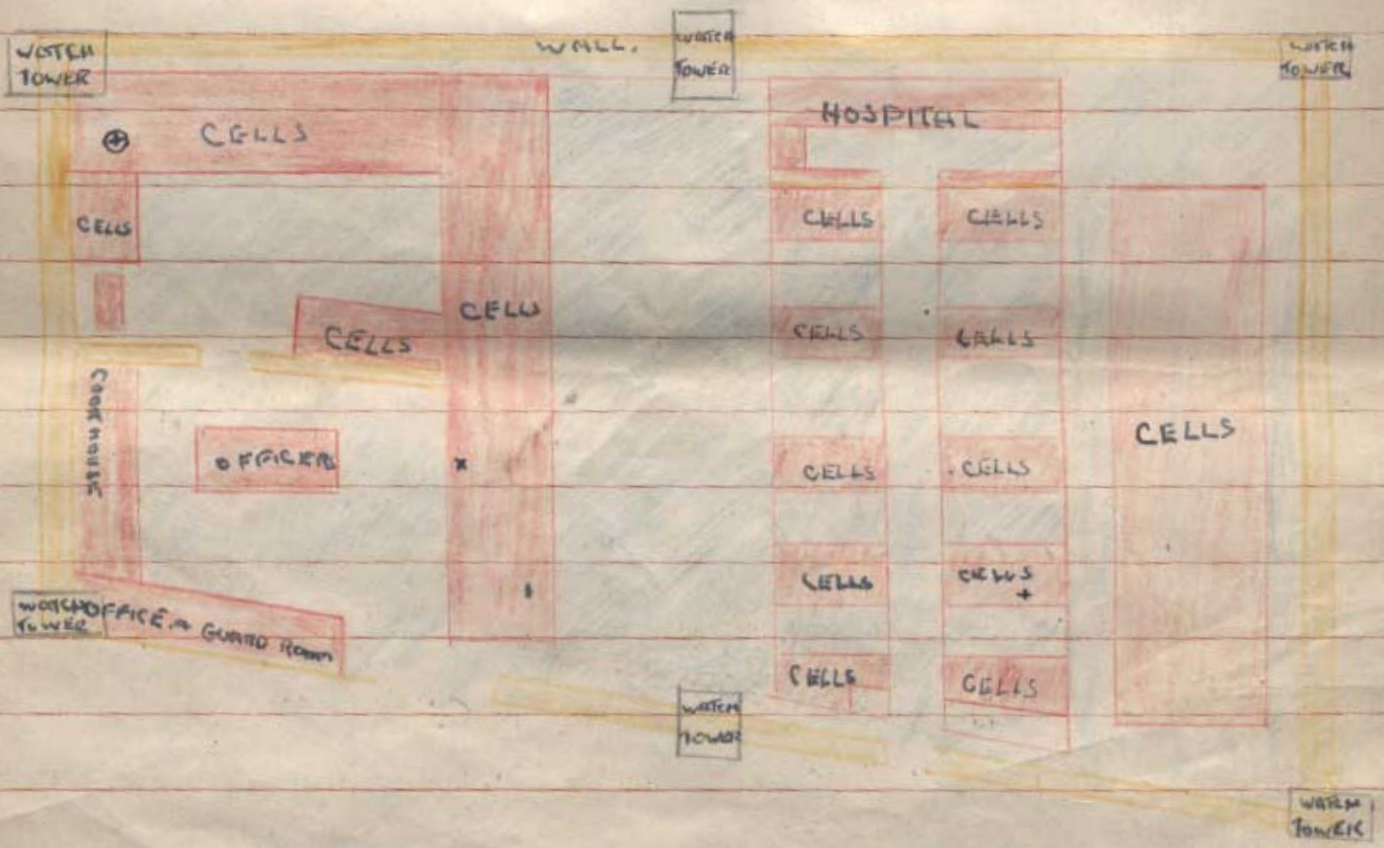
