

More damaging than the high-handed disposal of valuable property stolen by the Japanese from the British and the Americans is the symbolic manner in which it is done. One can well imagine that the turning over "with appropriate ceremonies" of "swank clubs" could not fail to be especially gratifying to Asiatic witnesses. For the exclusive clubs furnish a fair example of the sort of thing which already roused a resentment easy for the Japanese to exploit. Both points of view are perfectly understandable. The Americans and the British residing in the Far East were foreigners in an alien setting far from home. They tried to reproduce in their clubs an atmosphere as like as possible to something in their own countries. In this there was certainly an element of home sickness and not necessarily any element of arrogance. But the effect was arrogant. Not only was an opportunity lost to meet interesting and interested Asiatics in a pleasantly casual way on ground less formal and demanding than that of pre-arranged private hospitality, but local people including those of the highest distinction took note that they were excluded in their own country from a desirable social amenity.

In addition to pumping out a constant stream of out and out lies, impressive at last from sheer weight of repetition, the Japanese have ably played up and distorted everything connected with the white races which genuinely rankled, whether great or small.

The two chief methods by which the Japanese conduct their campaign against the Western democracies are "re-education" and the radio war.

"RE-EDUCATION"

In the main, the educational methods employed by Japan in the "Co-Prosperity Sphere" are those with which Germany has so painfully familiarised Europe. European languages are banned in schools, University libraries burnt. One of the first actions in occupied countries was to close the schools, and then re-open them with the curricula overhauled and thoroughly degraded from the academic as well as other standpoints.

4. CONTROLLING AUTHORITIES and CHANGE OF TITLE.

This camp was controlled as follows:

TOKYO CONTROL--established 18 Apr 1943
ended 14 Apr 1945

SENDAI CONTROL--from 15 Apr 1945
until present

9. DISPOSAL OF BODIES AND RECORDS.

All bodies were cremated and ashes sent to TOKYO. All records and identification tags are said to have been sent to TOKYO after the surrender by an order of the allied authorities.

10. DISTINGUISHING SIGNS and PROXIMITY TO MILITARY TARGETS.

- (a) Blackout was in effect at all times at night.
- (b) Large sized letters #9 were painted on the roof of the barracks after the surrender.
- (c) There were no distinguishing characteristics in connection with the entire camp.
- (d) A railroad track went through the S. W. corner of the camp.
- (e) It was 200 yards from the nearest military objective, the mine buildings.

11. MEDICAL FACILITIES.

(a) The PWs were treated in the PW camp hospital by the following PW doctors.

Capt. READE (British)
1st Lt. De WOLFE (Dutch)
Capt. RADE (Canadian)

- (b) There are possibly errors in the spelling of these names as they were given from memory.
- (c) A Japanese Dr. KAZUHIRO SHIRAKURA the company doctor of IWAKI MINE, visited the camp once a week on thursday mornings to treat seriously ill patients and advise the PW doctors.
- (d) Dr. SHIRAKURA stated that 60% of the PWs were suffering from Beri-Beri on arrival. A large number contracted skin diseases from scratching flea and other vermin bites after arrival at camp. Upon arrival at the camp approximately 60 PWs were treated on an average per day. This number dropped to 20 or 30 per day later.
- (e) Medical supplies were received from the company hospital and also the Japanese Army.

12. WELFARE.

a) FOOD

- (1) 705 gms consisting of 60% rice and 40% grains were given each PW per day.
- (2) 200gms of bread per man was given each day until June 1945 at which time only those workers in the mine received bread.
- (3) Despite difficulties in obtaining meat it was stated that 15-20 gms of meat a day was given each PW or 110-120 gms of fish was given.

It is emphasized that the forgoing information is derived almost entirely from interrogation of Japanese officials and civilians and therefore cannot be considered as accurate without further substantiation. All important records and papers were burned at the time of surrender under direction of the camp commandant. It is considered that all possible details have been derived from the source available to the Investigating Personnel but confirmation is required from documents which should now be in the hands of higher authorities.

According to Lt. Sano he had released the following:

- 1 Australian
- 187 Americans
- 105 English
- 2 Canadians
- 3 Dutch
- 2 Norwegians

He also reported that there had been no deaths, and no evidence of any deaths could be found.

A complete physical examination of the camp was made and very little evidence of any type could be found. The camp had been given a thorough cleaning and all windows and doors had been boarded over.

Lt. Sano informed us that the camp had already been visited by three(3) United States Army men who had arrived from Moroka. Their identity was unknown.

The buildings in the compound were in good condition and this was probably due to the fact that there had only been erected in May 1945.

The large building where the prisoners of war were quartered contained in addition to sleeping quarters, a kitchen, store room, latrine and the medical section. There were double tiers for sleeping purposes, the lower tier being of wood construction and raised above the floor level about one(1) foot. The upper tier was made of iron bars and was raised about five(5) feet above the lower tier and access thereto was by means of a ladder.

Results of Investigation of Prisoner of War Camps, Numbers three(3) and ten(10), Sendai.

2 Oct. 45

Departed Sendai 0900 and arrived Kurosawajiri 1430, with following personnel, E. A. Kennedy, Jr. 2nd Lt. Inf., T/3 K. Nakanishi 30106704, interpreter and Pvt. Keith D. Sones 37760052. Contacted local police authorities and learned that Prisoner of War Camp was located near an electric plant at Wagaseunin, about 14 miles on the road to Yuta. After leaving police, spent the night in Kurosawajiri.

Mileage Sendai to Kurosawajiri 89 miles.

3 Oct. 45

Proceeded to Prisoner of War Camp Number ten(10) and found a local policeman and 1st. Lt. Sano, who had been camp commander since 19 May 45, when this camp had been constructed. The prisoners arrived at the camp 31 May 45. Lt. Sano, apparently had some trouble in remembering the number of people at this camp, as he had forwarded his records to Lt. Col. Kitajima (in charge of Tohoku district prisoner of war camps.)

Captain J. R. DeBergh, Recovery Team Number 65 had previously contacted Lt. Col. Kitajima and secured rosters from him, which in turn have been forwarded to General Headquarters.

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The buildings in the compound were in good condition and this was probably due to the fact that these had only been erected in May 1945.

The large building where the Prisoners of War were quartered contained in addition to sleeping quarters, the kitchen, store rooms, latrines and the medical section.

There were double tiers for sleeping purposes, the lower tier being of wood construction and raised above the floor level about one(1) foot. The upper tier was about five(5) feet above the lower tier and access hereto was by means of a ladder.

Six(6) men sleep in each tier and the two tiers faced each other, giving accommodations for 24 men to a section, these sections being numbered. Lt. Sano informed us that the men slept on straw mats although none were in evidence.

A smaller building contained the guard house and two solitary confinement cells. Lt. Sano informed us that only one(1) man had been placed in solitary confinement and his offence had been that, he stole some sugar.

The few papers that were recovered at this camp are enclosed in a separate envelope marked "Papers Recovered at POW Camp #10 Sendai."

Upon return to Kurosawajiri we contacted Sendai Headquarters for northern Prisoner of War Camps at Satowake, and were told that there were no Chinese prisoners of war in this area.

4 Oct. 45

Departed Kurosawajiri 0800 arrived Prisoner of War Camp #3 located on road from Sawabe, 9 miles toward Iwagaski at Hosokura Kozau, a mining camp.

The camp commander was not present at this camp and there were only three(3) employees of the mining company. The camp was built in October 1944 and the Prisoners of War arrived in February 1945. Lt. Katsuo Ishizawa was the camp commander.

The mining employees told us that on 22 Sept. 45 there were two hundred forty-seven(247) Prisoners of War. They also stated that the ashes of those prisoners who had died had been sent to Toyko. The remains were reported to have been cremated in a retort at the mining camp.

Again in this case the camp, being of recent construction was in good condition. This camp had been cleaned and only a few papers were present, which are enclosed in separate envelope marked "Papers Recovered at POW Camp #3 Sendai."

The camp was of the same general structure as Camp #10, although at this camp they had latrines in separate buildings and separate building for an isolation ward.

Arrived Sendai 1500 this day.

At both these camps the company officials claimed they had no lists of the workers, as details of a certain number of men were sent daily, to work at the plants.

On 23 September 1945 the following information was obtained from Sister Saint Louis, Catholic Mission, Fukushima.

1. Apparently a great deal of Military equipment has been moved into the mountainous regions and secured in caves. This procedure commenced as soon as terms of peace were inaugurated.
2. According to her belief American troops should be especially cautious while proceeding through mountainous regions, as there is a possibility of unfriendly action.
3. There is a report that five drums of food dropped by parachute from American planes in the vicinity of Fukushima are in the hands of the local police.

Departed Tsugawa 0700 and arrived at Sendai 1930. Transmission on vehicle 62-B froze in second speed and had to be repaired

The only possibility of reaching Niigata was to return to Fukushima. At Fukushima we were informed by the police that to reach Niigata we would have to proceed north to Sendai. This information was partially confirmed by the Engineer's Office upon return to Sendai.

At Fukushima we met Father Martin Veillet, a Canadian Dominican priest, who conducted us to the Catholic mission, where we found five (5) Catholic nuns of the Congregation of Notre Dame. One (1) Sister Saint Louis was an American, the other four, Canadians. All were desirous of remaining here. Others had already be evacuated to their respective countries prior to the termination of hostilities. They all appeared in good health, although they had suffered some illness. They were interned at Wakamatsu and returned to their mission at Fukushima.

They reported that their treatment was not of the best, and that there was very little food.

We returned to Headquarters XIV Corps to refuel and to await further instructions

On 24 Sep 45 in Matsumoto, we drove around the town looking
for a possible location of a P.O.W. camp. We saw a few build-
ings enclosed by a high fence, but upon investigation these we
found them to be buildings of a silk factory. Continuing our
search we found another high fence fence. E. A. KENNEDY, JR.
buildings. Upon investigating it, we found 2nd Lt, Inf.
school. We continued our search investigating all buildings we

Lt. Heiji Mori, who was in charge of the camp said, "Eight of the prisoners died while at the camp. Most of them died of Beri-Beri. The bodies were cremated and the ashes were sent to Yokohama."

BUILDINGS

The main building was 48 by 16 paces. The part of this building used for billeting the prisoners was 31 by 16 paces and two stories high. The lighting was fair, having a window in the roof for the purpose of letting in sunlight and also the building was wired for electricity. There were no heating facilities visible and the guard in charge admitted that the prisoners suffered from the cold. The remainder of the building was composed of two store rooms which contained approximately 25 bundles of blankets, 15 bundles of coats (English), 25 bundles containing shoes, trousers and caps, 50 bags of rice, 50 cases of tea and some beans. There were also several bundles of American parachutes which had been used to drop food and medical supplies to the prisoners. The guards informed us that their orders were that the Occupational Army would collect this equipment. On the roof of the main building were painted the letters P O W in yellow and green; which should have been visible from a high altitude.

There was a latrine built at one end of the main building containing eighteen private toilets and a urinal which was eight paces long. There was no excess waste around the latrine. A lean to shed was at the other end of the main building with a water well and heating facilities for the laundry. On the well was a sign reading, "THIS WATER NOT TO BE USED FOR COOKHOUSE." The guard informed me that this water was polluted; but that they had a tap in the same building with safe drinking water.

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The kitchen was 9 by 16 paces. It was built of lumber with a tile roof and a cement floor. Large cracks in the walls made the building poor for winter use. The kitchen contained several

large cement bowls in which the prisoners cooked their food. The prisoners ate their food in their sleeping quarters.

At one end of the kitchen was a large boiler used for heating water for the bath. The bath tub was approximately two by three yards and four feet deep. At first the prisoners were allowed to take a bath four times a week, but later when it became difficult to obtain charcoal, the prisoners were only allowed two baths a week. A short time before being released, the prisoners were allowed a bath every other day. At the other end of the kitchen there were three empty store rooms.

The guard administration buildings and sanitary facilities were not much better than those of the prisoners. Near the entrance gate was an air-raid shelter, large enough for the guards only.

Lt. Heiji Mori informed me that the prisoners at this camp were the best fed, best clothed, and best quartered of any camp in the Northern section. One of the reasons for this was probably due to the fact that food and medical supplies had been dropped by parachute on 22 August 1944, 1 September 1944, and 11 September 1944. There were empty cans of dehydrated milk, roast beef, meat, and rice. There were also some cans of Japanese canned foods in a pile near the kitchen and a pile near the entrance gate. The guard said, "When the prisoners were imprisoned at this camp they averaged 57 kilograms in weight and when they were released they weighed 66.25 kilograms."

Lt. Heiji Mori said, "Some of the prisoners that arrived in October 1944 were wounded when their ship was torpedoed and sunk. These prisoners were in a very weakened condition after being in the water for two days before help reached them."

Lt. Heiji Mori told me the prisoners were worked from 0700 until 1530 during the winter months. And during the summer months they worked from 0700 until 1630. The prisoners worked at loading and unloading supplies from the trains and also they loaded and unloaded ships at the docks.

The guards said, "For recreation, the prisoners played basketball, softball, and went swimming in the ocean, which was about 450 meters from the camp."

Lt. Heiji Mori said, "The prisoners were allowed to have religious services every Sunday! We found a number of hymns written on paper. There were also about fifteen story books printed in English."

There was a twelve foot board fence enclosing the buildings and area of the camp.

Lt. Heiji Mori said, "The camp was opened 10 March 1944! The following men were the guards at the camp."

6. LOCATION OF CAMPS.

19 November 1943 to 9 August 1945 - YANOURAMACHI in KAMAISHI map reference 895-1851. This camp was eventually destroyed by naval shelling.

10 August 1945 to 15 August 1945 - School building in KAMAISHI map reference 894-1852. This was a temporary camp pending the availability of more suitable quarters.

15 August 1945 to 12 September 1945 - Theatre in OHASHI next to No. 4 Camp Map Ref. 881-1850. This was to enable the use of medical facilities and kitchen of No. 4 Camp.

As from 13 September 1945 - Military barracks building Map ref. 896-1856. This move is stated to be at the request of the PWs who were at this time free. Guards were provided only for their own protection.

7. MOVEMENTS OF PWs DETAILS AS FOLLOWS:

- (a) On the 19 November 1943, the first PWs numbering 201 arrived from Java.
- (b) On the 20th November 1943, a PW doctor was sent to the HOKADATE main camp.
- (c) In March 1944, 6 PWs (medical personnel) arrived from HOKADATE.
- (d) In August 1944, 5 of the above were sent to Tokyo main camp.
- (e) In May 1945, 200 PWs arrived from Tokyo main camp. No further particulars regarding the above could be ascertained.
- (f) Between November 1943, and December 1944, 18 PWs died of natural causes. (Incl. 9)
- (g) 32 PWs were either killed or died of from effects of Allied action. (Incl. 4.)
- (h) In August 1945, 24 PWs were sent to MORIOKA MILITARY HOSPITAL. (Incl. 5.)

"At the Steel Mills the following 17 PWs were killed by gas poisoning from a shell that burst in the mouth of a tunnel in which they were sheltered: WESSELS, ABELS, GAUSTAN, VAN GIESSEN, NAGTEGAAL, NIEUWDORP, VILIJN, WUBBELS, GOMIS, MASQUERRIER, SMITH F. T., BREDERODE, KEMPEN, KASTEEL, VAN ES, DALEN, VLEIRDEN.

"The tunnel was open at the other end but due to the intense shelling those inside could not leave. In the addition to those who died there were a number of other PWs who were poisoned by the fumes and also a large number of Japanese casualties. When the shelling stopped, Japanese and PWs cooperated in getting all the casualties out of the tunnel and gave them water and artificial respiration. The sick men were kept just outside the tunnel and moved as little as possible. This was in accordance with advice of Lt. BLACKSTONE (British).

"On the morning of 10 August 1945, TYMER, DOWNS and BRODIE who were injured in the camp, died. (Ref. Incl. 4).

"At 1100 hours planes returned and commenced machine gunning. The men suffering from gas poisoning were still just outside the tunnel so were returned under cover.

"In the afternoon the camp was established in the school. During this time several Helldivers bombed the station and the electrical supply lines to the city. WALSH an American (Ref. Incl. 4) was killed by a bomb fragment which came through the roof of the school and struck him on the forehead.

"On 13 August 1945 SMIT died from gas poisoning contracted on the 9 August 1945 and on 21 August 1945 VERMEULEN died under the same circumstances. On 24 and 25 August 1945, respectively, WILKINS and RUITEN died from burns received on 9 August 1945 (ref. Incl. 4).
