SUBJECT: Report of Deaths of Americans held as Prisoners of War and Statement of general conditions in the Umeda Bunsho Prison Camp, Osaka, Japan November 26, 1942 to July 31, 1943.

TO: Commanding General, United States Army of Occupation in Japan.

1. On November 26, 1942, upon their arrival in Osaka, Japan, from the Philippine Islands, a detachment of 458 officers and enlisted men, U. S. Army and Navy, were interned at Umeda Bunsho, Osaka, Japan. Five persons were transferred to the Tanagawa Camp, Osaka, leaving a total of 453. Of this number 30 officers were transferred to Zentsuji in January, 1943.

2. a. During the period November 26, 1942 to July 31, 1943, the officers signatory to this letter were interned at the foregoing named camp and either individually or together witnessed the deaths of 90 prisoners of war at the camp. (See Inclosure No. 1, List of Deceased).

b. Japanese camp officials removed 23 persons to outside hospitals for treatment during the period. Of those removed, 18 were reported verbally to the Senior American Prisoner Officer as dead. (See Inclosure No. 2, herewith). No means of verifying these deaths was available. Three of the 23 persons returned to the camp.

3. The following facts concerning contributory and direct causes of the unusually high death rate and concerning the treatment of prisoners of war in Umeda Bunsho Camp are submitted for your information:

a. Food.

(1) Food furnished the prisoners, consisting of cereals and small amounts of vegetables and fish, was insufficient in calorific content and was nutritionally unbalanced. During the period November 26, 1942 to March 10, 1943, we were informed that we were being issued 570 grams of cereal daily per person, which cereal was the major, and often the only item of food having any calorific content. Due to various leakages, unavoidable waste, etc., the actual cereal received by any person was much less than the stated 570 grams daily. Enlisted men and officers were required to perform the heaviest type of manual labor on this small amount of food with the consequent loss of weight and physical deterioration. Officers were coerced into volunteering for work details by threats of reduction of food to what is considered starvation levels together with threats of strict confinement to room space. At no time was the food furnished by the Japanese Army authorities sufficient in amount or quality to prevent dangerous nutritional deficiency diseases.

(2) On March 10, 1943, the Japanese Army was relieved

from the supplying of food to the camp and this duty was taken over by Nippon Tsuun Kaisha, a civilian railway forwarding company, by whom the prisoners were employed. At this time the amount of cereal was reduced to 470 grams daily per person. Other nutritional foods - beans, barley, bread, fish, fruit, and vegetables - almost disappeared from the diet. No change in amount of labor done was permitted. At various times small amounts of food were furnished by the railway company to prisoners at noon while working on the job.

(3) During the above period, Red Cross food delivered to prisoners by the Japanese authorities amounted to approximately 7 pounds per person.

b. Hospitalization and Medical attention

The camp hospital was organized on the third floor of the barracks building. Two Medical Officers, U. S. Army, were assigned by the Japanese to care for the sick. Medical Officers had very little power to dispose of medical cases and were continually overruled by the Enlisted Japanese medical attendant. Practically no medicines and no instruments at all were furnished, and such medicines as were available were often withheld by the Japanese for no apparent reason. The Japanese Surgeon rarely visited the camp during the period of highest death-rate. His examinations were most perfunctory. Sick prisoners were disposed of at the whims of the Japanese Enlisted Attendant. Men who should have had the greatest possible care were driven to work regardless of consequences. Dysentery, malaria, beri-beri, Oedema, and pneumonia were rampant, which diseases, owing to the weakened physical condition of the men, were causes of many deaths. At least one case of diphtheria was noted but was not permitted to be isolated or treated. Prisoners injured while working were placed in the camp hospital and thereafter neglected by the Japanese. At least one man, Storekeeper Chandler, U.S.N. (full name and serial number unknown) crushed in the legs and body by falling sacks of grain, suffered almost complete, permanent disability from this neglect. Upon being admitted to the hospital, patients' food rations were reduced to one-half regular rations.

c. Clothing and Housing.

(1) Sufficient clothing to enable prisoners to withstand winter weather was not furnished. The clothing furnished was thin cotton goods of poor quality. When worn out, clothing was not replaced. Shoes were a continual problem, resort being made by the Japanese to depriving persons sick in barracks of their shoes in order that workman might be shod. A few pairs of captured U. S. Army shoes became available after some months.

(2) Blankets were thin, cotton, sheet blankets inadequate to protect a person during sleep.

(3) Officers' personal clothing and equipment were confiscated. Protests were futile.

(4) The barracks building was of the warehouse type. Heat was provided during December, January, and February for about two hours per diem by means of small charcoal braziers. At other times the cold was unbroken.

4. The following statement of general conditions at the camp are also submitted for your information:

a. (1) Officers and enlisted men were forced to participate in Japanese style calisthenics regardless of their physical condition. The sick were driven from their beds to calisthenics. The beating received by one officer (First Lieutenant Robert W. Perkins, O-24578, CAC) when he could no longer keep up the drill was largely responsible for his subsequent death.

(2) Officers were coerced to volunteer for work by being threatened not only with loss of food but with subjection to so-called exercise in the coldest weather in unprotected areas without sufficient clothing.

b. Physical violence in the form of beatings with the fists and clubs, and kicks in the body was delivered upon all persons without respect to physical condition or without reason other than whim. Major Norbett W. Timmerman, O-314338, Infantry, while lying in a dying condition and crying out in his delirium was assaulted by a Japanese guard using his rifle butt.

c. Unusual, cruel, and excessive punishments were inflicted for petty violations of regulations. Two enlisted men accused of theft (Private First Class Edward T. Herzig, 19011291 and Corporal Robert I Farrell, (Marine) 268264) were, without trial, forced to stand at attention in the weather for 24 hours after having been unmercifully beaten with fists and clubs. The Prisoner Medical Officer was not permitted to attend these men. Both died within 3 days.

d. The Japanese endeavored to foment and foster ill-will between officers and enlisted men.

e. The Japanese failed to supervise the preparation and distribution of food and would not permit a responsible person among the prisoners to do so. Leakages occurred which were serious considering the amount of food available.

f. (1) Officers and men were continually humiliated in many ways. All prisoners were required to render salutes and personal honors to every Japanese military person of whatever rank or status and to some civilians upon sight. This rule was enforced within barracks to such an extent that no rest during daylight hours could be obtained.

(2) Upon one occasion while prisoner officers were being given Japanese military drill in the movements of the soldier, the Japanese instructor, a private, stood the officers at rigid salute (bow) while the Japanese proceeded to urinate in front of the formation in full view of many civilians in the area.

g. A person sick in quarters was not permitted to stay in bed unless he was so sick he could not stand on his feet. These persons were also required to undergo physical drill and calisthenics.

h. (1) Letters of protest addressed by the Senior Prisoner Officer to the Protective Power were not accepted by the Japanese Camp Officials for forwarding. No means of communicating in any manner with

relief organizations, our Protective Power, or our own Government was permitted.

(2) Prisoners were not permitted to speak to any Japanese inspectors who frequently visited the camp.

(3) At no time during this period was the camp visited by a representative of the Protective Power or the Red Cross.

5. The Japanese Officials concerned with the Osaka District, Prisoner of War Camps, and with the Umeda Bunsho Camp, are listed in Inclosure No. 3, herewith.

6. a. The above general statements can be substantiated as to specific instances and facts by testimony of the officers signatory and by other officers and enlisted men who were interned at Umeda Bunsho Camp during the foregoing mentioned period.

b. The specific cases cited in foregoing paragraphs 3 b, 4 a, b, and c serve only as examples. Similar incidents of equal severity occurred almost daily but are not mentioned herein because no written records are available. Paper and writing materials were forbidden at the camp, and the Japanese authorities, by continued searches and confiscations, deprived the prisoners of pertinent memoranda.


