a. Location: Yokohama camp # 14.

a. Location: Yokohama camp # 14 is located 200
feet to rear of Sojyi Temple, Yokohamashi Tsurumiku,
Tsurumi Maoni. Coordinates 670.2-1399.2 on Jentral Henshu
map scale 1/50000. This camp is also abranch of Omeri
Main camp.

Yokohama Jamp # 14 was originally located at the Tokyo Shibaura Electric Sompany, Yokoham Tsurumi, and was bombed the 16 April 1945. The camp was not destroyed but one POW was killed. It was again bombed the 12 of July and 25 persons were killed. This time the camp was completely destroyed. After this the camp was moved to the location mentioned above. It is known that while the samp was located at the Shibaura Electric Sompany some POW died of pneumonia. Prisoners of War in Yokohama Camp # 14 worked in the Shibaura Electric C mpang factories. Working hours were from 0700 to 1120 hours and from 1200 to 1700 hours. One prisoner was killed while working in the factory.

C. Condition of the camp: There were 2 barracks of

c. Condition of the camp: There were 2 barracks of 1 story and approximately 50 yards long. In these same two buildings were the kitchen, latrines, warehouses, dispensary ote. The area is 60 yards long and 45 yards wide and inclosed by a tight board fence 8 feet high. There were 221 prisoners kept in this camp, 12 American, 20 British, 17 Australian

and 72 Dutch.
