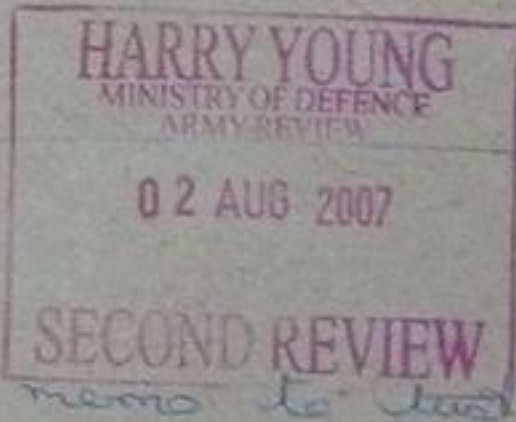

11. Col. Houston, Maj Hunt, Capt Taylor, Capt Young, and
Capt Turner were most outstanding in their work with "H" Force

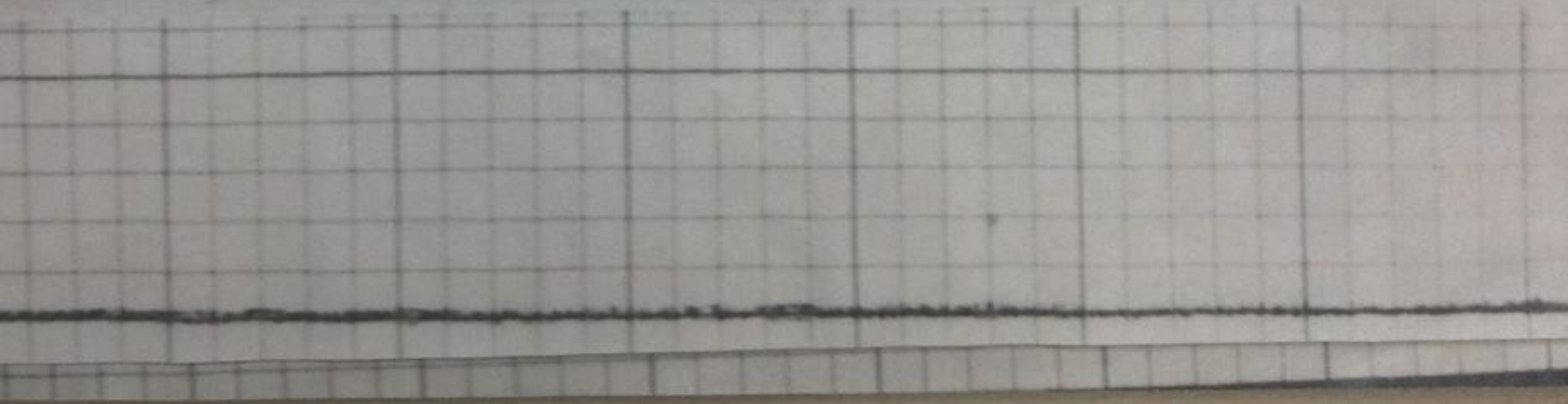

In obedience to your request, the writer submits herewith General Report covering "H" Force personnel remaining at Kanchanabri Hospital No 1 and 2 from 8 December 1943 to 26 April 1944 (both dates inclusive) and arriving Singapore 29 April 1944.

Discipline and Morale.

The discipline and morale of all ranks were very low for the first ten days after movement of the main body of "H" Force to Singapore. The writer paid special attention to each case (including Officer patients) and found that it was necessary to have a few words with each patient at least twice in twenty four hours. This policy was greatly assisted by M.O.'s of each ward where "H" Force bodies were located. During this last 3 months it was noticeable the improvements taking place in each case, which the writer considers was due to the great interest and liason taken by respective Ward M.O.'s.

Lt. Col. Houston, Maj Hunt, Capt Taylor, Capt Young, and Capt Turner were most outstanding in their work with "H" Force personnel, in fact the M.O.'s of both "I" and "F" Forces endeavoured to assist at all times in the treatment of our personnel.

The writer had a conference with each M.O. at least twice or more frequent where patients were on the D.I. or S.I. list and based on the Medical advice plus information obtained from the Camp Q.M. and Messing Officer I was able to determine what special food should be purchased for "H" Force personnel.

On frequent occasions patients asked me to thank both M.O.'s and Medical staff for the manner in which they were receiving their treatment from time to time. "It was made quite clear to our patients that the assistance granted to them was made available by Command "H" Force (Lt. Col H.R. Humphries, R.A.) before he left Kamburi district with special instructions to the writer that everything possible was to be done for both the welfare and health of each patient. All C.R. patients were acquainted with the fact that each Officer of "H" Force had contributed to this special fund that "H" Force Officers with my party continued their contributions to Command "F" Force special Hospital Fund. It was found that the patients concerned could be made realize that their Officers were endeavouring to assist at all times

and they dismissed the prevailing idea that it was a matter of course that they should receive extra rations and not appreciate what was being done to eliminate their sufferings etc.

Entertainments.

Daily and nightly entertainment of a good variety was well organised by all fit Officers, N.C.O's and C.R's within the Hospital, more especially by the 7 January it was possible to cater for all classes of entertainment as new huts were erected and Wards were classified under Medical Surgical and Dysentery wards.

Water^{and} Rations

The I.J.A. Their administration greatly reduced the issue of water, rations and fuel. This was overcome by being able to purchase food and the I.J.A. Lieutenant C.O. Hospital worked very hard on behalf of both "F" and "H" Force patients in obtaining special permission for the stepping up of "F" Force personnel in obtaining all the fuel and extra water required.

Recreation.

The I.J.A. Officer made a playing field available also allowed electric light throughout the No. 2 Hospital, lights being controlled by a central switch, with an extra switch for the operating Theatre.

I.J.A. Assistance.

A marked difference was noticed by the "F" Force I.J.A. Officer and all his other ranks. They endeavoured to do everything within their power to assist our Medical and administration personnel in carrying out their duties to all concerned. This I consider was due to the very efficient manner in which Lt. Col. Houston and his staff carried out their duties at all times. Lt. Col. Houston personally handling some very delicate situations by reasoning with the I.J.A. and the Hospital as a whole received the benefit of this good work.

Movements.

The movement of all personnel from No. 1 Hospital to old fit camp now known as No. 2 Hospital was successfully carried out without a hitch by transport made available by the I.J.A.

The movement of personnel from Kamburi on 21 April 1944 to Singapore was very well arranged so that B.I. cases had a bed throughout the journey there being four beds to each truck, the total number of personnel to each truck being 25. The writer made available 50 cents to all "H" Force patients (Officers excepted) so that fruit could be purchased on the South bound trip.

"F" Force also made 35.00 ticule available to each truck C.O. and the purchase of eggs and fruit was very well organised whereby all personnel received a reasonable amount of food in addition to the two issues of I.J.A. daily throughout the journey. It was noticed that the motor truck journey from Singapore station on the 29 April 1944 to Belgarang Hospital was rather disturbing to some of our S.I. cases. I consider this was due owing to the very fast speed at which we travelled.

Clothing.

No further issue of clothing was made to "H" force personnel by I.J.A., issues were made from dead men's kits.

Deaths.

Attached list will show 20 deaths of "H" Force personnel including the Dutch Commander Cornelius. 42 personnel returned safely some bodies still requiring further Medical treatment. Regarding the death of Commander Cornelius. This Officer appeared to fully recover from his illness about the end of December and a recurrence of his Dysentery and other diseases came about during January and Capt Young the M.C. responsible for the Dysentery ward worked very hard in an endeavour to save the Commanders life. Special medicines food and treatment was made available including assistance from time to time by the I.J.A. "H" Force Officer when it was found necessary for the use of the Operating Theatre at night and special Medical Stores from Bangkok. The writer also made available special food for ten days after a long discussion with Captain Young as it was thought necessary special liquid diet would help to save his life. The Death certificates have been left with second echelon with all details etc.

"H" Force Amenities Fund.

The attached certificate will show that £ 642.33 was duly expended on "H" Force sick personnel less Officers for special food consisting mainly of fish, eggs and milk where necessary.

The amount of £ 20.00 expended on Commander Cornelius was refunded by Cadet Cornelius after his Father's death, and an issue of 50cents to each "H" Force C.O. was made ~~for~~ the journey south to Singapore.

Officers Pay Cards.

All Officers pay cards fully completed up to date along with certificates were handed in to Command Pay on 12 May 1944.

As C.O. "H" Force Detachment I have been requested by English, Australian, and Dutch patients (all ranks) to convey to Command "H" Force their many thanks and appreciation for assistance received from all "H" Force Officers.
