- 5. Japanese Roll Call-296 men present.
- 6. Reports as to men left on the road vary from one to five.
- 7. Officers on detail were:
 Jerry O. Gonzales, Capt. dead Henry J. Pierce, Capt-Japan.
 Paul A. Ashton, Capt. Bilibid
 Thomas H. Rhodes, 1st Lt Camp #1
- 8. Sick were taken to Bilibid on June 14, 29 and July 14- Camp closed on July 28, 42
- 9. On trip to Bilibid on June 29, 1942 W. D. Courtier, Ser. No. 19004347, died and was left on roadside.
- 10. Richard, W. A., M-Sgt., is also listed in the Camp O'Donnell death records indicating that the O'Donnell Identification maybe based on Richard's Cards in the possession of another man.
- 11. 68 men died and are buried at the Camp Site which is in a river bed on the boundary between the provinces of Tayabas and camarines norte, Philippine Islands.
- 12. Information concerning the detail was obtained from the following sources:
 - (a) Letter dated Aug 6, 1942 from Capt Pierce to Commander Sartin at Bilibid.
 - (b) Personal records of Capt. Ashton.
 - (c) The questioning of every known member on the detail present in Camp no I both individually and as a group at one meeting.
- 13. Due to the lack of paper for keeping records at the camp site many of the names and other facts are compiled from memory. Hence the list will undoubtedly contain errors in names, serial numbers, dates of death and organizations.
- 14. In light of the above, the following list of men are believed to be buried at the camp site.



Cody insists that he will have the operation performed at Pilibid Prison. He says that, "when I return to the states, I want to be able to walk ". 10-16-42.

SUMROW, CLOYD W. "Jack" received a nasty shrapnel wound in his foot on the morning of the Nipponese invasion. The attention given him by medicos on the "rock" left his large toe stiff-the Doctors at Bilibid Prison are planning an operation, using some form of plastic, which will leave his foot in good shape. 10-16-42-.

CHANCY-YANCEY B. * In addition to the recommendations for Silver Star and Cak Leaf Cluster, Lt Chancy had previously been recommended at least 4 times for distinguished service with the Navy-one of these recommendations carried with it a recommendation for award of the Navy Cross (similar to the distinguished service

cross)-two of these recommendations were for services, beyond and above the call of duty, performed during heavy bombing raids at Cavite Navy Yard, Cavite, P. I. - one of these recommendations was for similar services at Mariveles, Bataan, P. I. - Commander Bridget, USN knows of the fourth engagement, at Pucot Hill, Bataan, P. I. - it is believed that the records of these recommendations were destroyed, two of them by fire at Bavite, P. I., and the other during the evacuation of Bataan-at the time of these deeds Lt Chancy was a civilian-
