1. Report on Kawasaki Camp # 24
a. Location: Kawasaki Camp # 24 located along waterfront near Nisshin Flour Mill Company. Coordinates
674.2-139.2 on Central Honshu Map Scale 1/50000. Kawasaki
Camp # 24 also located in Kanagaken Kawasakishi Chmormachi
district.

b. Description of Camp: Mawasaki Camp # 24 was opened 20 December 1944 and closed 30 June 1945 it was respend 27 July 1945 and closed at the end of the war. The camp was constructed of 1 story wooden barracks. There were 10 buildings large and small in the camp. The camp was 51 yards wide and 78 yards long, and was surrounded by a wooden fence 8 feet high. The prisoners worked in the Nisshin Flour Mill Company, loading the bardges there were some prisoners however who operated machines in the factory. The Prisoners worked from 0730 to 1200 hours and from 1250 to 1700 hours.

There were 70 prisoners in the camp, 35 American and the

rest were British and Australian.
