Explanatory Preamble

Synopsis

About the end of July our Shanghai agent wired stating that there was a sincere desire among a faction of the Japanese to come to an understanding with the Chinese Central Government which would lead to a cessation of hostilities in China. Blank sent a bogus reply stating that, as pre-requisite evidence of Japanese sincerity, the Chinese Government required the Japanese party interested to promise that the following three terms would be implemented: -

- A. The Emperor of Japan to assume full control of all armed and political forces in JAPAN.
- B. The Sino-Japanese situation to revert to status quo prior to the Mukden Incident.
- C. The War Criminals to be punished.

The Shanghai agent was instructed to put the foregoing to the party who had approached him and in the event of a favourable reaction to signal us about the 20th November.

In due course his wire was received stating that TOKYO reaction was favourable and yesterday the following wire was received.

INWARD TELEGRAM FROM SHUNAN, CHEKIANG

JAPANESE PEACE OFFENSIVE

1. The preliminary terms on which the Chinese Government is prepared to consider peace with JAPAN, as outlined in your telegram dated 9th August, have been communicated by HO, acting on behalf of HSU JU, to Admiral KAZDA. The latter is the senior Japanese naval adviser to the Puppet Nanjing regime. (NOTE BY BLANK: HSU JU, whose full name is

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HSU JU HWEI, is better known as HSU TSUNG CHI. He is a senior military official and formerly a prominent member of the Kwangtung of the Kwangtung clique.)

2. In TOKYO, peace overtures are favoured by the following: -

- (a) Prince HIGASHI KUNIROMA, Prince KANNIN, Prince CHICHIBU and Prince MIKASA, all members of the Royal family.
- (b) KIDO KOICHI, ICHIJO SAITAKA and KONOYE, of the peerage.
- (c) OKADA and YOWAI MITSUHARA, of the Navy.
- (d) MASAKI JINSAIBURO and SHIMURA KAIJI, of the Army.

3. It is known that the above people have obtained the acquiescence of the Emperor in these overtures which are also supported by the big financial community. It is also hoped to initiate peace parleys with the Allies simultaneously with a coup d'etat carried out by MASAKI and ISHIKAWA on the pretext of enforcing military discipline.

4. As early as May, TSUCHII was sent to SHANGHAI by OKADA and KONOYE to approach HSU JU through HO with a view to sounding out opinion in CHUNGKING regarding the successors of General TOGO. The only two Army men in CHINA who were in any way connected with this mission were Lieutenant-General MAEDA and Colonel TSUJI.

5. On 12th October, as a result of a report from MAEDA, KONOYE sent his younger brother Baron HASEGAWA to SHANGHAI by plane on a secret mission. He saw HO and informed him that the Allied terms, as follows, could be carried out: -

- (a) The Emperor should take over the administration.
- (b) War Criminals to be punished.
- (c) The offensive to be halted.
- (d) MANCHURIA to be handed back to CHINA.

At the same time he wished that the authorities in CHUNGKING should address a note to the Emperor which would enable a formal petition and request to be presented to the Emperor. A high Japanese official would then be sent to CHUNGKING to negotiate peace, the Cabinet would be re-organized, hostilities would cease and Japanese troops would be withdrawn.

6. On 21st October, HASEGAWA returned to TOKYO by aircraft and shortly before his departure he left a letter written by himself personally for HO (so as to show that he would trust HO) in which he stated that he considered that the present was an opportune moment for the Allies to start a political campaign against JAPAN which might result in: -

- (a) The establishment in power of a Japanese peace faction. This faction would serve as an antidote to those people in JAPAN who aimed at fighting to the end on the mainland. This would weaken the Japanese war effort and promote internal changes and strife.

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(b) The slowing down of the Japanese offensive in CHINA, which would enable the Chinese to gain time to re-organise for a counter-offensive.

(c) Negotiations of the same type as the U.S.S.R. - FINLAND peace negotiations, i.e., to conduct peace talks with the party aiming for peace while at the same time the Allies were actively preparing for an offensive.

7. HO has been nominated by HSU JU as his representative and HO is prepared to help carry through the project even at the risk of his life.

8. Two most important points should be borne in mind, that the enemy should be convinced of the authenticity of the peace moves, while the Allies should fully bear in mind that they are only designed to deceive the enemy. (NOTE BY BLANK: It should also be fully understood that the so-called Allied "preliminary terms" were actually drafted by BLANK who considered that the only way to induce the enemy to conduct a peace offensive was to give them some sort of a lead. If the enemy carried out any of the terms and then was cheated, internal troubles and changes would undoubtedly result and, at the very least, agents in our employ would have excellent openings and opportunities of obtaining intelligence.)

9. Please discuss these plans with Allied staff officers and officials in CHUNGKING and send me further instructions by wireless as soon as possible.

HSU MING CHENG

(NOTE BY BLANK) Baron HASEGAWA TADAHARO inherited the title of HASEGAWA and is the younger brother of Prince KOMOTO.

(NOTE BY BLANK: HO and HSU MING CHENG are both our agents.

....The meeting of 16 Aug 1945, in the course of which it was decided to proclaim independence the nextday, was held in the house of and in the presence of admiral MAEDA. For that matter, the Japanese fleet has always felt favourably towards the Indonesian independence movement, more than the army. MAEDA had personal relations with several nationalist leaders, like SOEBARDJO, minister in the first republican cabinet.

MATSUMOTO Shunichi, Minister Plenipotentiary to Indo-China in 1944-5, is directing this enterprise, and Lt. General <u>WATANABE Ikujiro</u> is assisting in relations with the Chinese Nationalist mission personnel and merchants who are involved in the financial guaranty and in backing the expedition as well as offering travel protection near Formosan waters and in the South China Sea. This forthcoming expedition to Indo-China will carry no Japanese troops for the Viet Minh Government, but merely military intelligence and propaganda specialists who are to serve with either the Vietnam government or with HO Chi Minh or with both. The Chinese Nationalists have been promised the intelligence product of these operations, and will actually get some of it. The operations will be controlled by Japanese personnel of the "UGAKI Groups".</p> <p>4. WATANABE Ikujiro and MEMOTO Hiroshi are two separate identities. At a meeting on 11 Aug 1950, a man introduced as Vice-Admiral TERAOKA or TERASHIMA (sic) and one introduced as Lt. General WATANABE Ikujiro were present at the port of Tokyo to discuss latest developments of plans. The latter individual is working in concert with MEMOTO and will also return to Formosa on one of the ships.</p>

3. An organization called the "Cabinet for Joint Sino-Japanese Operations" was initiated in the early months of 1948. Policy-makers of this group on the Japanese side were Vice-Admiral KOBAYASHI Shosaburo, Lt. General (or Vice Admiral?) KAWAGUCHI Tadaatsu, Lt. General WATANABE Ikujiro, and YOKOYAMA Yui. At Mr. YOKOYAMA's residence at Kamakura, a conference was held by these four men on 22 Mar 1948 to formulate plans for joint operations with the Chinese National Government. YOKOYAMA was placed in charge of diplomatic and liaison relations with the Chinese, NEMOTO and WATANABE were to direct military and intelligence operations, and KOBAYASHI was made responsible for the funds and procurement of funds.....

4. The first three expeditions were primarily for the purpose of fund-raising to support larger expeditions; because every time serious difficulties were encountered in raising funds after ships had been rented and personnel recruited. The Chinese government was willing to pay after delivery of the troops, particularly mechanized warfare specialists and naval gunners; Japanese ship captains were willing to take the risks of smuggling, stowaway, and contraband charges if they were paid a substantial guarantee before the voyage. Difficulties were also encountered in personnel recruitment because of the necessity for clandestine approaches and vagueness as to destination, and because of the inability to pay guaranteed contract bonus

5. In spite of these difficulties, WATANABE Ikujiro and MUTO and over 1,500 Japanese troops were smuggled into Formosa in this manner during 1949.....

11. The "fifth expedition" is scheduled for 15 October 1950. Twelve ships will be used, including those not "blown" on the fourth expedition....WATANABE Ikujiro himself will serve as deputy commander.

"17 Crewmen Sent to Public Prosecutor's Office in Connection with Smuggling Case"

Nakayama - Seventeen crewmen, including Captains OKACHI (岡崎) and SHIMURA (下村) of the 3rd Maruyoshi Maru (19 tons) and of the Titen Maru, both seized at OSHIMA Port by the Nakayama Prefectural National Rural Police Headquarters, were sent to the public prosecutor's office on August 20 on charges of violating Imperial Ordinance No. 311. A certain ABANURA (阿波内) 33, a crewmember of the 8th Maruyoshi Maru who escaped arrest at Shimizu Port, Shizuoka Ken, was rounded up at Oshima, Nakayama Ken and also sent to public prosecutor's office.

A "man behind the curtain" under search Shimizu! - The Maritime Safety Agency at Shimizu ordered on August 21 a nationwide search for a certain WATANABE (渡辺) who was proved to have asked MUTO Kasutomo (室戸 - 一), 27, at Kashimagi, Shinjuku Ku, Tokyo To (新宿区), in charge of navigation, to procure three ships and thirty-three crewmen. This was subsequent to interrogation of Captain SHIBI (柴井) and crewmen aboard the 8th Maruyoshi Maru. This certain WATANABE is believed to be residing in the vicinity of Kyoto.

New Report from "Mainichi" Evening Newspaper, 22 August  
(TRANSLATION)

"Former Navy Vice-Admiral Involved in the MAEYOSHI Maru Case. Ship-owner YAMAMI Missing."

Kagoshima - It has been confirmed that shipowner YAMAMI Kochiro, age 45, who has taken a key part in the 8th MAEYOSHI Maru Case, had been staying at the Taiho Hotel at Miyazaki-ku, Kagoshima-ku until the early morning of August 18 was HASEKI Kippei (八瀬 喜平) age 55, who was said to be a former navy vice-admiral and chief of the Navy Intelligence Section of Former Imperial Navy Headquarters, and had left there for China on August 18.

Smuggling to Formosa uncovered at Nakayama - 16 crewmen of the 3rd MAEYOSHI Maru and TATSU Maru which were rounded up at Oshima Port, Nakayama-ku, have undergone interrogation under confinement at the Nakayama District Procurator's Office and have confessed their plan to assemble at Kmino Shima, Kagoshima-ku for a smuggling trip to Formosa.

NAKAMITSU and TERADA are chief deputies of the group, which canters about the HEIWA Trust Co, while FURUYA Tatsuo and OIKAWA Michio are now in full charge of mounting operations into Formosa to aid NEMOTO and WATANABE Ikujiro.

Both have served on Formosa previously, NEMOTO going from Formosa to Peiping where he was a Chief of Staff to the North China Command. Although both have been to Japan recently several times and "WATANABE" is still in Japan with the intention of commanding personally the fifth expedition to Formosa once it gets underway, they may properly be considered the representatives of the UGAKI Federation to the Chinese Nationalists on Formosa for the purpose of joint operations: military, smuggling and intelligence. They will also have a hand in the mounting on Formosa of Japanese operations against the mainland with the logistic support of the Chinese "RANISHA". NEMOTO will be in charge of the placement of Japanese troops on Formosa and the contact to whom Japanese operatives dispatched to China and Indo-China will report, since the UGAKI Groups have little intention of permitting the Chinese Nationalists to get control over the operations or of giving them more than a by-product of the information gained. On the other hand, control of operations going THROUGH Formosa</p>			
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or being mounted or re-mounted on Formosa will be retained by Tokyo groups and individuals; NEMOTO, as a military man and a non-professional in intelligence work, will serve only as contact and channel.

One reason why [ ] feels MAEDA Minoru may actually be the real identity for WATANABE Ikujiro is that recently the names of both OIKAWA Genshichi and MAEDA Minoru have been linked in newspaper accounts with the ill-fated fourth expedition to Formosa, and the rumors of MAEDA's whereabouts therein printed fit in general with what [ ] knows to have been "WATANABE Ikujiro's intended movements. In addition, WATANABE Ikujiro has long been considered an alias for something, and "WATANABE" uses considerable Navy terminology at meetings. We reserve judgment; [ ] himself offered it as an opinion.
3. The following additions to previous information may serve to identify a few of the top leaders more clearly:
  - a. Lieutenant General WATANABE, Ikujiro may be an alias for Navy Vice Admiral MAEDA Minoru, who was at one time during the war at Gunshireibu and connected with the Formosan fleet base at Taipei. "WATANABE" is about fifty-eight, stocky, and bald-headed with a ring-shaped fringe of gray hair. His present address, when he has been in Tokyo, is in Suginami Ku. He works closely with NEMOTO and uses the latter's two Tokyo offices, one of which belongs to the KAWAGUCHI Kikan.

It is recognized that this may take much longer than the reconstruction of a Japanese Army for defense purposes, but without the revival of the Navy, the ultimate objective will be lost for obvious reasons. Support of the HATOGAMA Clique for rebuilding of a Japanese Navy is assured and MAEDA is to act in conjunction with that Clique in the attempt to bring members of the YOSHIDA Government around to that viewpoint, in accordance with KOBAYASHI Sho-			
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zaburo's plans. MAEDA is not considered to be such an extreme militarist as KOBAYASHI, so his chances of success are better with politicians who feel KOBA-YASHI to be dangerous.

At the same time, those former Navy figures within the Maritime Safety Agency such as YAMAGUCHI, TANIGUCHI, and SHIMIZU, particularly the latter in his capacity as Personnel Chief, are to insure that the "Navy Faction" within MSA wins out. Almost all recent personnel shifts and new recruitments as well as certain dismissals, in MSA have been in favor of the "Navy Faction" and against the Civil Marine Service veterans. In addition, technical advice and plans from American GHQ concerning Kure, Sasebo and Yokosuka which are given to MSA are to be forwarded to MAEDA and KO-BAYASHI for study and future reference. MSA is now virtually controlled by the Navy Cliques.

A. The Main Kikans to Date.

This section is limited to those groups and agencies dealing in the procurement of information, regardless of the other activities they undertake simultaneously, including lobbying and other efforts toward J.I.S. re-establishment. The stronger and better-organized groups in the field of secret operations have been until quite recently those which enjoyed the favors and financial support of American agencies; the semi-overt agencies, having greater permanence but less power, have belonged to one department or another of the Japanese government.

(8) Navy Groups.

There is not to our knowledge any highly organized group of ex-Navy I.S. professionals at present concentrating upon the procurement of information. There are several prominent individuals and groups, either working in conjunction with ~~KA~~ ABE Torashiro and his subordinates or independently, which have figured very prominently in clandestine operations concerning Nationalist revival: notably, ~~K~~ KUBAYASHI Shozaburo, ~~K~~ KAWABURA Yoshio, ~~K~~ AEDA Minoru, and ~~K~~ KAWABURA Kichisaburo, and their subordinates. Their chief activities have been directed at the manipulation and subversion of the Maritime Safety Agency, maintenance of liaisons to ~~K~~ ENOMOTO Hiroshi and the Chinese Nationalist leaders in Formosa, ~~K~~ MURRA's high-level negotiations for revival

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of a Navy and work with GHQ, and ~~MAJU~~ ~~MAJU~~'s plans for a revival of Naval Intelligence. ~~X~~ KOBAYASHI Shogaburo maintains a general supervisory position over ~~X~~ KARAEUCHI Tadatoshi's ~~tiken~~ including Vice Admiral ~~X~~ SHIMA Jiro's group, the "REISHISHA" (organization (now closely affiliated with NABEYAMA's World Democracy Research Association), the Heiwa (Peace) Trust Company, and ~~X~~ KAIGUCHI's vague directional duties with the KIKUSUI KAI (Chrysanthemum Water League) and the Japan Anti-Communist League. At the same time, KOBAYASHI vaguely superintends and sponsors the JUNAN-Japan Peoples Independence and Self-Defense League (now under the banner of "GENYOSHSHA") of ~~X~~ KURIHARA Sho and ~~X~~ SATOJI Ryosaku. IANEDA, KAIGUCHI, KAWABURA, former (Captain) ~~X~~ FUKUSHIMA (son-in-law of the late Admiral YAMAGOTO), and several former Navy officers and Navy I.C. subordinates such as ~~X~~ FUNUYA Tateuo and ~~X~~ TONITA Kozaemon are members of that group. It is not, however, an exclusively Navy organisation nor is it, designed to carry out intelligence activities. (Cf:below)

C. 1951. The Change in the Character of Leading Organizations. Pg. 14  
The beginning of 1951 brought a definite change in the nature and policies of the leading groups because for the first time they were able to cooperate more optimistically and practically, the means to attain their real objective. Intelligence operations may mean the establishment of Japanese intelligence service, but a build-up of political power is the creation of the Japanese armed forces. Powerful groups of veterans are concentrated on these broad aims.

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The earlier visit of Mr. Dulles had awakened hopes of an early peace treaty, Pg. 45 the probability of rearmament and the possibility that after the peace treaty the Rightist political objectives might be gradually achieved. Subsequently, the hope that the purge might be lifted for many more former diplomats and politicians had added to the feverish planning. The JONAN Enterprises Company - People's Independence and Self-Defense League Group is an excellent example of the new type of underground group which emerged. It is not a cover company, nor is it merely a lobby group, and it is definitely not an intelligence-gathering agency although some of its members occasionally peddle information to get personal or organizational funds and it includes a secret planning staff for the re-creation of the Army and possibly Navy Intelligence Services. All of these functions are provided for, but the major purpose is infiltration of the Japanese government executive agencies, particularly the "stop-gap army" (National Police Reserves), the Maritime Safety Agency, the Foreign Office, and presumably in the future, the Army itself and the entire political structure. The membership represents every field and service, and its liaison connections to other powerful groups, particularly KAWABE's, are good. The Asiatic connections are strong, especially to "Third Force" Chinese. It clearly shows the new, broad objectives of clandestine operations by underground groups since it is organized to fulfill all of them. The JONAN Group contains former politicians like BABA Yusuke and AKASE Den with connections to OKADA Shumei and HATOHAMA Ichiro; former diplomats URIHARA Sho, TSUCHIDA Yutaka, and KAMAI Tatsuo; ex-Army leaders TANAKA Shinichi, OBA & SAKURABA Shiro, and, lately, OIKAWA Gen-shichi; former Navy leaders YAMADA Kinsaku, KOBAYASHI Shozaburo, KAWAMURA Yoshiro, and Admiral YAMAKI TO's son-in-law Captain FUJISAWA, in addition to officials in the NSA who are former Navy men; former I.S. and Tokumu Kikan figures like NISHIHARA Kazuo, Deputy G-2, Kwantung Army, and WACHI Takaji of RAN Kikan;

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last but hardly least, it includes SATOMI Ryosaku & Hajime, sometime associate of KODAMA's in China and supporter of the Army Intelligence Units in China by virtue of his vast economic operations, legal or otherwise - a shadowy "friend" of the great in every field.

9. The Navy Problem.

If a Navy is re-established, the most likely figure to front for it is NOMURA Kichisaburo. If there is no Navy, the Maritime Safety Agency will probably be greatly expanded for coastal patrol and defensive purposes. It will be manipulated and infiltrated by subordinates of KOBAYASHI Shozaburo and MAEDA Minoru of JONAN, possibly under NOMURA's top-level advisory authority. If a Navy is authorized, the personnel controlling its subordinate intelligence service cannot possibly be determined at this stage. Other than the non-professionals mentioned above and KAWAMURA Yoshiro, also of the JONAN Group, we know of

no possibilities. In the event a Navy I.S. is re-established it would probably be selected from among former exports now engaged in other occupations. If limited to an expanded MSA, the JONAN Navy wing is almost certain to dominate it and any minor intelligence agency it may possess. However, many former Navy I.S. personnel will continue in their other employment or will attempt to establish themselves within the Foreign Office agencies or even the Army agencies, relying upon the close post-War relationships they enjoyed with Army kilan leaders.

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In the formulation of the Hokushinkai MAEDA was named one of the Navy representatives. (ZJL-772, 20 Dec 51, CE File III-36.2).

MAEDA was listed as a sponsor of the Hokushinkai. (ZJL-793, 30 Jan 52, CE File III-36.2).

A policy maker on the Japanese side (UGAKI JIS Groups) of the "Cabinet for joint Sino Japanese Operations." At meeting 22 Mar 48, subject and NEMOTO Hiroshi, qv., were appointed to direct military and intelligence operations with the Chinese National Govt. These two and over 1,500 Japanese troops were smuggled into Formosa during 49. Subject will serve as deputy commander of a fifth expedition scheduled for 15 Oct 50. (ZJL-436, 31 Aug 50, CE File III-43).

The two key figures in these liaisons, joint operations, and military cooperations are NEMOTO Hiroshi, qv, and WATANABE Ikujiro, both called Army Right. Subject is now in Tokyo, but maintains an effective intelligence liaison to NEMOTO Hiroshi on Formosa. MAEDA'S agency is merely a logistic and communication facility, not an actually operative kikan except by aid of the Chinese mission of another JIS organization.

Through his logistic operations agents are being filtered in to Bangkok and Saigon.

He is located at Fujiya, Toranomon Tokyo, but he also utilizes NEMOTO Hiroshi's office in the Teikoku Bank Bldg. His principle subordigate is OKADA Terusato, believed to be a former Navy commander. (ZJL-483, 13 Nov 50, CE File III-36.2.).

Subject received some unfavorable publicity for his dealings in the Maruyoshi Smuggling Case. (ZJL-538, 26 Jan 52, CE File III-36.2).

Former Vice Admiral MAEDA Minoru (0467/3944/4457) visited Taiwan late in the spring of 1952, ostensibly for the purpose of making surveys preparatory to salvaging Japanese ships sunk in Formosan waters. Actually he spent most of his time there establishing contact with Nationalist's Ministry of National Defense (MND) for the purpose of getting Nationalist support for a secret intelligence organization to be run in Japan. Using letters of introduction given to him by KO Lan-ch'ing (5502/6031/3237), a Chinese living in Tokyo, MAEDA managed to meet TING Chieh-min (0002/0094/3046), deputy chief of the MND, who asked him to set up such an operation.
2. Returning to Japan, MAEDA boasted to members of the Attorney General's Office (AGO) and the Cabinet Investigations Chamber (Naikaku Soridaijin Kambo Chosa Shitsu) that he had obtained a large sum of money from the Nationalists to organize an intelligence system in Japan.
3. KO, whose name is probably a pseudonym, was a special agent in Peiping for TAI Li during the Japanese occupation of China. After the war he worked for the Nationalists against the Communists in North China and went to Taiwan with the Nationalist government, working in the intelligence bureau there. KO came to Japan in June 1952 ostensibly as a trader, but actually his mission has been to contact Chinese residents in Japan who have connections with Chinese Communists for the purpose of using them as agents in both espionage and sabotage activities directed against the Chinese Communists.
4. KO was first introduced to MAEDA by NISHIMURA (fmu) (6007/2625), former secretary to former State Minister MATSUMOTO Joji (2646/2609/3532/3112). He is living at the house of MASAKANE Kikuta (2973/0369/5468/1129), a Japanese to whom he had been introduced shortly after the end of the war, and whom he took care of until MASAKANE was repatriated.
5. MAEDA is attempting to bring KO and MASAKANE in contact with the Cabinet Investigation Chamber. About 20 July he requested KO to write out a detailed PHS on MASAKANE, saying that MURAI Jun, head of the Cabinet Investigations Chamber, wanted it. KO refused. On 30 July MAEDA suggested that MASAKANE and KO meet MURAI. Both agreed to do so.

Ku Lan-ch'ing<sup>2</sup> (5502/6031/3237), longtime Chinese Nationalist intelligence agent who arrived in Japan during June 1952, was able to meet Attorney General KIMURA Tokutaro (2606/2625/4648/1129/6745) on 8 August and talk with him for thirty minutes, through an introduction of TANAKI<sup>1</sup> (fmu) (3763/6349). Their conversation ran as follows:

KIMURA at first showed a great interest in the C. C. clique, of which KO is an influential member. KO evaded KIMURA's questions and changed the subject.

KO stressed the importance of Sino-Japanese cooperation in lifting the activities of the Japanese Communist Party (JCP) and of its sympathizers among the Chinese residents of Japan. KIMURA agreed with KO and said that he would be willing to support joint activities against these two groups by appropriating funds from the Public Safety Investigation Agency (Kōan Chōsa Chō) (PSIA).

At the end of the meeting, YIL-URU expressed a desire to have more meetings with KO.

2. Former Vice-Admiral WAEDA Minoru (11467/304/14457), who met CHENG Chieh-min (6740094/3046), deputy chief of the Ministry of National Defense, Chinese Nationalist government, during the early summer of 1952 and was asked by CHENG to set up a Nationalist-sponsored intelligence operation in Japan, called on KO late in July, and asked him to find out why CHENG had not re-contacted him (WAEDA). KO refused to do so.

3. The meeting of WAEDA, KO, MASAKAWA Mikuta (2973/0369/5468/1129), and WU (2625/0064/7311), suggested by WAEDA on 30 July, had not occurred as of 12 August.

1 Source Comment. TAKARI is reported to be a former count who was well known in business circles. He is a close relative of MAEDA and went to Taiwan with MAEDA during the spring of 1951. It is reported that he will become chief of the accounting section of MAEDA's intelligence organization when it is organized.

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2 Field Comment. According to ZJJ 169, KO introduced MAEDA to CHENG. The same report claims that KO is a Nationalist agent whose mission is to contact pro-Communist Chinese residents in Japan with the purpose of using them as agents in both espionage and sabotage activities against the Chinese Communists. The Japanese Government has refused to allow the use of the Imperial Plaza for the May Day rally. It has suggested the Meiji Shrine as an alternative, but permission to hold the rally there has also been refused because the grounds were ruined by last year's demonstration. Ueno Park, which is also being considered, will hold only 60,000 to 70,000 people. 200,000 demonstrators are expected to participate, however, and since the police want to localize the rally, they will try again to get permission from the Shrine's head priest to use the grounds. If the priest does not reconsider, police will have to be dispersed over all of Tokyo.

2. MURAI, Jun (1625/3064/7311)<sup>2</sup> desired to place NISHIMURA Toshiro (6007/2625/474/7160)<sup>3</sup> in the Defense Section, but was forced to relinquish this plan because of the opposition of YABE and YAEKI Minoru (0467/3944/4457). NISHIMURA is still working in MURAI's office in documentary intelligence.

3. MURAI has initiated procedures to resign from his position in the Guard Section of the National Rural Police in order to concentrate on his duties as Chief of the Cabinet Research Chamber.

1. Field Comment. The development of the communications intelligence aspect of this organization has been reported separately, most recently in FO 127.

2. Field Comment. MURAI, as Chief of the Cabinet Research Chamber, has been coordinating the formation of the new central intelligence organization, although no definite commitment to make him head of the organization when formed has been reported to us.

In 1931 he was Naval attache to the Imperial Embassy to U.S.S.R.; and again in 1938 was Naval attache to the Imperial Embassy to U.S.S.R. and concurrently Naval Attache to the Imperial Legation to Finland. He was made Vice-admiral in Nov 1943 and Commander-in-Chief. 10th Air Fleet in Mar 1945. In March 1946 was attached to Second Demobilization Ministry.

INFORMATION: Chief of the Information Div. (Concurrently the Chief of the 3rd Div Naval General Staff on 18 Oct 1941 when the cabinet change took place from the KONO's to TOJO's.

The NIPPON TIMES, dtd 28 Dec 50 states that a Moscow newspaper The Pravda charged Americans with organizing volunteer Japanese to fight in Indo-china and Korea. It stated that Vice Adm MAEDA and other former Japanese naval officers were being used as advisers in Asian naval blockade tactics.

MAEDA Minoru is one of the Officials of the PATRIOTIC AND SINCERITY SOCIETY (Junkoku Shisei Kai) Atami-shi, Shizuoka-ken which was formed in 1950 and is comprised of 13 branches with the total of 3,000 members at the present time. (The Patriotic and Sincerity Society is an extreme rightist organization, reportedly well organized and who is waiting for the opportune time to carry out their ultra-nationalistic ideologies. This organization favors rearmament of Japan. The "Tosei" faction of the former Jap Army is believed to be the nucleus of this organization.

"PROPOSED CHINESE INTELLIGENCE AGENCY IN TOKYO"

On 19 Jul 52, MAEDA Minoru, former Vice Admiral, Jap Navy and TAMARI (fmu) former titled personage, returned to Japan from Formosa with the following missions:

1. To organize a Chinese Intelligence Agency with hqs in Tokyo.
2. To contact Jap Govt agencies to facilitate the organization of this agency.

Since MAEDA's return he has been able to contact MURAI, Jun (Chief of the Diet Investigation Section) through Tamari, who was able to arrange this meeting through the private secretary of Prime Minister Yoshida. During the meeting, MAEDA outlined the contemplated mission of the organization, and requested the help of MURAI to coordinate their work in the future. Lt Gen NYU, (Chinese Nationalist Army) was mentioned as the proposed chief of this organization.

During the latter part of Aug 52, Lt Gen NYU arrived in Tokyo and contacted MAEDA. He then, along with MAEDA, held a conference with Murai concerning the organization of the proposed agency. Since this conference, the initial phase of organizing this agency has started, and Maeda is presently receiving 30,000 yen a month from the Diet Investigation Section, Murai has made plans to submit a request for funds in the next budget to finance a portion of the above operation. Lt Gen NYU has also contacted Kimura, Tokutaro, Attorney General, but the reason for this contact is not known. During the first week of Sept 52, NYU held a conference with the following former Japanese officers to get their opinions concerning the invasion of the Chinese mainland, and their tactics if such an invasion were contemplated:

The information concerning the establishment of the Chinese Intelligence Agency is presently known to the Yomiuri Newspaper, Soviet Press, Maritime Safety Agency, and the National Rural Police.

Lt Gen NYU is scheduled to return to Formosa on or about 20 Sep 52.

MATSU Report No 1091 dated 10 Oct 52

I. In Jun 52 former Vice Adm MAEDA Minoru went to Formosa in order to contact the Nationalist Govt authorities in connection with the raising of sunken ships. However, this plan came to naught, but he was able to meet leading figures in the Chinese Govt in Taipei. As a result he was asked by Lt Gen TING Chih-Min, Asst Chief of the General Staff in the National Defense Ministry, to engage in Intelligence activities in Japan for the Nationalist Govt. (Note: MAEDA was an expert on the Soviet Union for the former Jap Navy. However since he was Naval Attaché in Nanking he knows quite a few people in Nationalist Govt circles.

II. MAEDA at present is attempting to organize an intelligence network. It is true that he got in touch with MURAI Sunao of the Cabinet Survey Office after his return to Japan, and he is now a member of this Survey office. (It is said that his salary is 20,000 yen a month.)

NOTE: The Cabinet Survey Office has the job of gathering and evaluating information on Communism and MURAI Sunao, who is the Asst Chief of the Police Affairs Dept in NRP Hqs, is serving as its Chief.

III. NIU Hsien-ming (Lt Gen) a superintendent in the continental Campaign Section of the National Defense Ministry of the Nationalist Govt, came to Japan from Formosa in August 52. His prime objective here was to study the feasibility of sending spies to the Chinese Mainland from Japan. NIU met with MAEDA and other former service personnel.

NOTE: MURAI is not the chief of the Diet Investigation Section but is the Chief of the Cabinet Investigation Chamber. He has been engaged in the collection of intelligence from the beginning, and he made plans to conduct investigations concerning matters related to the future defense of the nation. Hence, he procured the services of MAEDA and others and charged them with the work of conducting research on Chinese and Soviet Problems.

There is no basis for the report that MAEDA is working under MURAI to form or assist in the formation of a Chinese Intelligence organ.

The object of Lt Gen NIU's meeting with MURAI and MAEDA was solely to establish a Japan-Sino consultation organ in Tokyo. He is convinced that the future of NatChina govt depended solely on its friendship with Japan.

In the spring of 1952, MAEDA visited Formosa ostensibly for the purpose of making surveys preparatory to the salvage of Japanese ships sunk in Formosan waters. Actually, MAEDA spent most of his time establishing contact with the Chinat Ministry of National Defense to get Nationalist support for a secret intelligence organ to be run in Japan. Upon his return to Japan, MAEDA reportedly told the CRC and others that he had obtained a large sum of money for this purpose. Since 1952, MAEDA has been connected

During 1955-56, MAEDA's research Institute BOEI MONDAI KENKYUJO (Defense Problems Research Institute) also called MAEDA KENKYUJO (MAEDA Research Institute) shared a ¥ 4,000,000 allocation from the CRC budget with 5 other organizations under the Category "concerning Southeast Asia"; during 1956-57 the organization was allocated ¥ 500,000, but actually received ¥ 980,000; in 1957-58 they were allocated ¥ 980,00 again.



Appraisal of Content: 3.

1. The 11th Central Committee meeting of the Japan Democratic Youth League (Minseido) was held on 9 and 10 January 1963; the first day at the Bunkyo Ward Hotel Association office and the second day at the Futaki Ryokan, Bunkyo-ku, Tokyo. This meeting was held to prepare the central committee report for the 8th Minseido National Convention to be held from 25 to 27 January 1963 at the Nihon Seinen Kan in Meiji Park.
2. On the second day of the meeting, 10 January, Central Standing Committee member OBIKAWA Junichi asked for a vote of no confidence against Secretary General MAEDA Minoru and explained in detail the reason for such an action. As a result, by majority vote, MAEDA was voted out. Central Standing Committee member TSUCHIYA Yoshio was elected acting secretary general until the national convention.
3. The reasons given by OBIKAWA for the vote of no confidence were as follows:
  - a. MAEDA has been maintaining regular weekly contact with MITA Kazumi, a member of the Socialism Reform Movement (SRM) and a purgee from the Japan Communist Party (JCP);
  - b. MAEDA without proper authority embezzled over ¥500,000 from the Minseido Finance Department. Over half of the amount was spent by MAEDA in his campaign to become a JCP Central Committee candidate member. He obtained the money just before

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
the 8th JCP National Convention in the summer of 1961 from Minseido Headquarters Finance Department chief OZEKI Kiyoko, who made available the money from the organization fund. At that time, OZEKI had been a sympathetic follower of MAEDA. She recently became a mistress of TSUCHIYA Yoshio and under TSUCHIYA's questioning exposed MAEDA's misconduct.

- c. MAEDA is guilty of "loose talk" especially in discussing confidential internal problems of Minseido, in public.
- d. MAEDA has failed to unify opinions within Minseido.
- e. MAEDA's moral conduct is increasingly being criticized by Minseido members. MAEDA's affairs with female members are too numerous to be ignored.
- f. MAEDA is responsible for the split within the organization by following and advocating the Soviet line of strengthening the organization through the peace movement. OIKAWA and TSUCHIYA, on the other hand, advocate the HAKAMADA Satomi line of strengthening the organization first and then participating in struggles.

4. As a result of Minseido's action against MAEDA, the case has been taken up by the JCP Control and Audit Committee for appropriate action.

1. Field Comment. The 31 January Mainichi Daily News reported that a Japanese intelligence service has confirmed the removal of MAEDA as secretary general during the Minseido 8th Convention. The report said MAEDA's removal is allegedly the result of internal conflict within Minseido, reflecting the current Sino-Soviet dispute. The new Minseido secretary general was identified as TSUCHIYA Yoshio. The 31 January Akahata reported that four members of the Minseido Central Committee had visited the Mainichi main offices to protest this report, charging that it was utterly unfounded and a malicious frame-up designed to slander Minseido. See also FJT-8937 from a different official Japanese service for late 1962 information regarding the increased power of the Minseido pro-Chinese Communist faction led by OIKAWA Junichiro.

1. Japan Communist Party (JCP) Central Committee candidate member and former Japan Democratic Youth League (Minseido) Secretary General MAEDA Minoru was hospitalized at Yoyogi Hospital, Tokyo, by order of the JCP mainstream faction before the 25-27 January 1963 Minseido Eighth National Convention. He was removed from the Minseido secretary generalship during this hospitalization.<sup>2</sup> MAEDA's illness was diagnosed as rheumatism, and he recuperated at his residence. MAEDA started work at the JCP Headquarters Youth and Student Department on about 20 February 1963.<sup>3</sup>
2. The JCP Presidium has decided to send MAEDA to Communist China in the near future. The ostensible purpose of MAEDA's travel will be recuperation from his illness, but the actual purpose will be to indoctrinate him in the Chinese Communist viewpoint.

Field Comments

1. FJT-8195, 16 May 1962, reported efforts by JCP mainstream leader HAKAMADA Satomi to remove MAEDA from Minseido leadership.
2. FJT-8938, 12 February 1963, reports the removal of MAEDA by the Minseido 11th Central Committee meeting on 10 January 1963. The 31 January 1963 Mainichi Daily News reported that a Japanese

intelligence service had confirmed MAEDA's removal during the Minseido Eighth National Convention. The 31 January Akahata reported that four members of the Minseido Central Committee had visited the Mainichi offices charging that the Mainichi report had been untrue. Field Comment to FJT-9052, 20 March 1963, noted that MAEDA did not attend the Minseido Eighth National Congress.

3. MAEDA has not previously been a member of the JCP Headquarters Youth and Student Department.

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
